A Thought on April 8

Maybe you've heard how salvation is like a total solar eclipse: God doesn't see our sins because Jesus' holiness covers them completely. Or maybe you've heard how trials can cause an "eclipse of faith." At WorldChallenge.org, Pastor Gary Wilkerson explains that in Greek, *eclipse* means "I am absent" or "I cease to exist," because people once thought the gods temporarily extinguished the sun. "For Christians, a 'spiritual eclipse' is a dark hour when God seems to be absent from our lives," Wilkerson writes.



Wilkerson points to Peter being sifted like wheat, Elijah and Jeremiah facing extreme discouragement, and David collapsing morally. Amid Satan's attacks, "God seems completely absent," writes the pastor. "In that dark moment of eclipse, the devil has created such chaos we can't possibly see a way out." During times of testing, Christians must cry out to God and trust his faithfulness.

Completing the eclipse analogy, Wilkerson shares Titus 3:4, the "love of God our Savior appeared." The Greek meaning of *appeared* here is *superimposed*, he writes. God looks on our fraught-filled times of eclipse and "superimposes his divine love over us."

Matthew 25 Ministries (M25M): Palestinian Relief

The UUC Board of Elders has designated M25M as our April Mission of the Month. M25M continues to ship Palestinian relief aid in 2024. What follows is a summary of what they are doing: "We are communicating and working with partners serving the area with whom we have strong, long-term relationships to help safely and securely provide aid to the many people that have been impacted by this crisis.

"As of early February, 2024 Matthew 25 has shipped nearly 25,000 pounds of aid to partners serving the crisis area. These shipments have included essential supplies such as personal care items, paper products, blankets, and more. Matthew 25 will continue working with partners to identify how we can best support the ongoing needs of the area."

One hundred percent of all donations goes directly to relief efforts. Please be generous when making out your check to UUC with M25M in the memo line.
