Holiday Luncheon Results: from Jan Porter Thanks to the hard work and generosity of UUC people and community attendance and enjoyment, the total earned was \$2,146.65. This is good news because it is the first time in the three years, since our two year hiatus, that we have made over \$2,000, all without raising prices for the luncheon options. Every \$2,000 helps the UUC budget.

Financial Update - Moving in the Right Direction

Our operating budget-operating income gap narrowed more in December than initially reported. We had additional donations after Sunday December 29 received by mail that narrowed the gap to 17%. (Down from 29% on November 30.)

Income through December 31: \$82,961

Income needed through December 31 to make budget: \$99,875

As an independent church, not affiliated with any denomination, UUC is funded entirely by individual members and donors. We need a steady stream of financial support and volunteers to enable us to pay salaries and utilities and to help maintain our facilities and programs.
